I understand the dead/disabled horse ruling and I agree to abide by it.

This rule applies to the cut-off date - 9:00 a.m. on the 1st day of the fair.

At the discretion of the advisor and upon notification to the Hancock County Senior Fair Department Superintendent, a 4-H member can use another 4-H member's horse for grade only. This applies to horses coming up lame, ill or not fit to show prior to Jr. Fair time.

If the leased horse is to replace a dead horse, it may be shown on Jr. Fair Days for placement. If the leased horse is for a disabled animal, then for grade only.

The lease of the replacement horse must be presented in writing to the Extension Office.

A certificate of death or disability must be provided to the extension office, signed by a licensed area veterinarian who is approved by the state ODA.
