Hancock County Renewable College Scholarship:

Recipient of this award is a graduating senior of the current year and will receive \$500 each year for up to four years while attending an accredited college. To renew the scholarship each year, the recipient must maintain a 2.8 GPA and submit his or her transcript by June 1st to OSU Extension Office in Hancock County for renewal for the following year. This scholarship is sponsored from funds earned through the Hancock County 4-H OSU Columbus Endowment.

Hancock County 4-H Council Graduating Senior Scholarship:

Hancock County 4-H Council Alumni Scholarship:

- If needed, applicants will be asked to participate in a selection interview with members of the Hancock County 4-H Advisory Council.

Rules and Eligibility Guidelines

- Applicants must have been a Hancock County 4-H member for a minimum of three years.
- Applicants must be pursuing or planning to pursue a degree from an accredited two or more year post-secondary institution.
- Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 2.5 to apply.
- Application should be accompanied by one letter of recommendation from a responsible community member. (Person should not be related to the applicant.)
 - This letter can include information regarding the applicant's 4-H participation, skills acquired through the
 4-H program (leadership, communication, etc.) and involvement in the community.
- Please attach a photo suitable for recognition as a Scholarship recipient.
- Do not attach additional pages to this application.
