Pullorum Testing will be offered as a drive thru event: Tuesday, August 2nd starting 6:00-8:00pm at the Buckeye Barn at the Hancock County Fairgrounds. Please enter the barn on the south side closest to the dairy barn. Cost: \$1 per bird tested paid in cash

Anyone with a bird that is over a year old is required to provide a valid health certificate. This pullorum testing will provide a health certificate only for the specific birds tested. Turkeys cannot be Pullorum tested. Waterfowl do not require health certificates.

Market Hog Projects: The 2022 Swine Show at the Hancock County Fair is a terminal show with the exception of arranging your own slaughter with proof. You must inform the Swine Superintendent, Ryan George, by **August 1st** if you will be taking your market hog(s) home to be slaughtered after the fair.
