Happy first day of June! Did you know that June- Dairy Month started in 1937 as a way to distribute extra milk during the warmer months of summer. Sponsoring organizations established it as National Milk Month. In 1939, it became the offical "dairy month" which we still celebrate today!

Here are a few fun dairy facts:

- 1) All 50 states and Puerto Rico are home to dairy farms
- 2) 95% of U.S. dairy farms are family-owned and operated
- 3) Cows drink 30-50 gallons of water each day
- 4) Top 5 dairy producing states are: California, Wisconsin, New York, Idaho and Pennsylvania
- 5) On average, cows produce 7 to 9 gallons of milk a day, or around 128 glasses

OTHER NOTES:

4-H Camp: The theme will be "Gettin' Wild Western Style". Camp will be June 25-29 this summer. Registration is open and available to sign up all camp registration will be \$250. There is NO High Ropes course available this year. Remember to turn in all pages: Registration, guidelines, and health forms. Camp fees are payable to OSU Extension, Hancock County. There is a camp bus this year. It is \$25 to ride the bus and is a round trip. Bus check is payable to 4-H Advisory Council of Hancock County. LIVESTOCK:

Quality Assurance: All members with livestock projects are REQUIRED to complete Quality Assurance. Our final session will be June 4 starting at 9:00am at the Hancock County Fairgrounds in the NWO Show Arena (next to the hog barn). You must be on time and stay for the entire meeting. If June 4 does not work in your schedule, please feel free to contact one of the surrounding counties and check when their QA meetings are. Remember YQCA is also an option for anyone 12 and older as of January 1 of the current year. A QA course MUST be completed by July 10 for the Hancock County Fair and completed by June 6 for the Ohio State Fair.

Rabbit Projects: Reminder anyone taking rabbits to the fair must have at least one single rabbit in their possession by June 1. This rabbit must be registered with Bev Welty via email (bcwelty@msn.com) by June 1, along with stating the breed and tattoo with the exhibitor's name. EMAIL BEV TODAY!!

There will be a Rabbit Clinic following quality assurance on June 4. You can bring your rabbit or just come and watch, listen, and learn more about your project.

Sheep and Goat Projects: Weigh in and Tagging will be June 2 located at the fairgrounds from 6pm-8pm. All sheep must be shorn.

All Dairy Beef Feeders: Tagging, vaccination and weigh-in for **ALL** dairy feeder and dairy-crossbred calves will be held June 9th from 6:00pm-9:00pm at the Hancock County Fairgrounds. Sponsors will cover the expense of the first two calves weighed in (dairy feeders: Hosler Corbin Insurance, dairy/beef crossbred: Boes Family Farms), exhibitor's will be responsible for any other calves vaccinated (\$8.00/calf). Exhibitors will also pay for mulch bedding to be provided at the fair at this time (\$10.00/calf).

New Horse Project Member Orientation: If you missed the mandatory new horse project member orientation on April 13, 2022, you will need to log into the EquiSTEP program, watch the helmet and sportsmanship videos and write a paragraph or two about what you learned. Submit that paper to either Lauren at burner-kitzler.1@osu.edu or Kathy at biery.12@osu.edu before you may ride at any riding meetings. The "Horses, Safety, and You: How to Work With and Around a Horse Safely" must also be completed.

Horse Projects: Those who did **NOT** attend the Horse Clinic on May 28, **MUST** complete the EquiSTEP video course using the link provided. https://cfaesosu.catalog.instructure.com/courses/equine-safety-training-and-education-program-09-mz2-e41. Once completed, drop off or email your certificate of completion to Kathy at biery.12@osu.edu. The course needs to be completed and certificate submitted by June 10.
