OTHER NOTES:

4-H Camp: The theme will be "Gettin' Wild Western Style". Camp will be June 25-29 this summer. Registration is open and available to sign up all camp registration will be \$250. There will be No High Ropes course available this year. Remember to turn in all pages: Registration, guidelines, and health forms. Camp fees are payable to OSU Extension, Hancock County. There is a camp bus this year. It is \$25 to ride the bus. You must ride both ways. Bus check is payable to 4-H Advisory Council of Hancock County. LIVESTOCK:

Quality Assurance: Remember YQCA is an option for anyone 12 and older as of January 1 of the current year. A QA course MUST be completed by July 10 for the Hancock County Fair and completed by June 6 for the Ohio State Fair.

YQCA: <u>ONLY</u> members 12 years old or older as of January 1 may complete YQCA. In the past, this has been a \$12 course. Go to https://yqcaprogram.org and find more information under MORE INFO >> YOUTH & PARENTS. Remember, we do not accept the "Test-out" version of YQCA and only members 12 years old and older as of January 1 may complete YQCA. **Important Note for YQCA:** If you have completed, email certificates to Kathy to fulfill your QA requirements.
